## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

First off, I hope you all enjoyed the months away from school, our Michigan weather, and continue to be healthy. The past 18 months have been challenging for all of us in a variety of ways amid the pandemic. Many of us have experienced trauma, isolation, financial strain, sickness, and uncertainty. My hope is that returning to school will bring a sense of normalcy for students and parents/guardians. My priorities remain to keep Carleton Middle School a safe and supportive environment for all students to learn. However, this year I would add a place to embrace our students' social and emotional challenges. More so than ever before, we need to support our students in their academic, behavioral, social, and emotional learning. Parents, throughout the school year, if you need help or assistance please rely on the school to be your partner to help your child learn, grow, and overcome any obstacles you may face. We are here, working alongside you, to encourage and help your child develop, mature, and learn.

Two-way communication is one of the keys for a successful school year. Please keep us updated about any email or phone number changes that occur during the school year. We regularly send out robo calls that go directly to your listed phone number and/or email if your permissions allow. Also, every Friday we send out a Carleton Chronicle highlighting what our students have been learning during the week and have a Carleton Twitter page @CarletonColts, Instagram at carletoncoltswcs, and school website for families to access information. In addition, through the pandemic, our students and teachers used Schoology as a platform to access their online work and a warehouse for assignments and assessments. This will continue this school year so please make sure you and your child are comfortable navigating the technology.

Carleton is a Title I building as determined through the Michigan Department of Education. Title I is a supplemental program from the federal government that provides funds to our school to help students achieve academic standards. We are able to provide our students with specific classes, learning opportunities, and access to resources that would not normally be available with only using state funding. It also means the staff at Carleton constantly evaluates the needs of our students and establishes rigorous goals in the areas of reading, writing, math, science, and social studies in order to benefit all of our students. The funds from the federal government help to establish and implement research-based programs to help our at-risk youth and to work with all stakeholders. Some of the programs in place due to Title I are Math Intervention Support, Reading Intervention Support, and summer enrichment opportunities. Under federal law, you as parents may request the following specific information about the professional qualifications of our children's teachers:

- 1) Whether the teacher has met the state qualifications/licensing for their grade level/subjects.
- 2) Whether the teacher is on a temporary permit or waiver.
- 3) The teacher's majors, graduate certificates/degrees, and discipline fields.
- 4) Paraprofessional services and qualifications.
